

## CART CARE

With the right care your new Curb Cart will last you for many years without needing maintenance. Your new Curb Cart is cleaner, since it doesn't allow odors to escape and it can be cleaned using a regular garden hose and dishwashing soap. **DO NOT** place hot ashes, construction debris, and/or hazardous waste in the Cart. **DO NOT** paint or write on your Cart. Each Cart is labeled with a serial number, residents should take note of the number of their specific Cart. Residents will be responsible for lost or damaged carts.

## HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

Unless you are notified otherwise by Republic, there will be no collection on the following holidays:

New Year's Day	Memorial Day
July 4 <sup>th</sup>	Labor Day
Thanksgiving Day	Christmas Day

When a holiday falls on a weekday, there will be no collection on that day, and the rest of the week's refuse collection will be one day late than normally collected.

## YOUR NEW SOLID WASTE PROGRAM

Republic Waste Services is pleased to have the opportunity to provide you with an improved solid waste collection program. You will now be provided with a 96-gallon Curb Cart to contain and dispose of your weekly Solid Waste. That's equivalent to 3 regular trashcans in one.

Curb Carts should be placed at the curb with the arrows on top of the Cart pointing toward the street. Curb Carts should be placed at the curb **NO LATER** than **7:00 AM** on your collection day. **ALL refuse must be in your new Curb Cart.** Materials that are not placed in the Cart will not be collected.

Please make sure that there is nothing between the cart and the street. Also, leave 4 feet between your Curb Cart and other objects so we can service you quickly, efficiently and safely.

## BULKY ITEMS

Bulky items are anything you cannot place within your Curb Cart or can, such as carpet (must be bundled no more than 3ft in length and secured for one person handling), water heaters, mattresses & box springs, furniture and large appliances. Residents that need to have bulk items collected must contact Republic to arrange for these items to be collected.

## Recycling

Recycling will be collected every other week along with your weekly solid waste. All recyclables must be placed in the recycle bin prior to setting curbside.

### Glass Bottles

- Clear glass only – Rinse & Remove lids
- Food & Beverage containers only
- No Pyrex, window glass, ceramics, light bulbs, mirrors, or broken glass.

### Metal Food & Beverage Cans

- Metal food and beverage cans, also lids from glass bottles and jars.
- Rinse clean; labels may be left on cans.
- Flatten cans to make more room in your bin.

### Plastics – PETE #1 & HDPE #2

- Plastic bottles such as milk jugs, water jugs, laundry and hair bottles types # 1 or # 2.
- Rinse well. Remove caps. Labels may be left on containers.
- No motor oil containers.

### Newspapers

- Place flat in the bottom of your recycling bin, or place in a brown paper grocery bag only.
- Newspapers can include color comic sections and glossy inserts.
